Never Mind The Aurochs!

Derby Museums is inviting its visitors to explore the hidden layer worlds of bedrock and earth - and then into the light, to look at our own human story of life on the surface - through [Earth Bound](#), a spectacular exhibition of sculpture, portrait photography and tiny but powerful creatures blown up to a huge scale. Now on show at the Museum of Making through to 18 January 2026, it features photographs by Kate Bellis and Alex Hyde, alongside work by sculptor Sally Matthews, who gave the initial energy to the exhibition. The sculptures by Sally Matthews prowl the gallery space - extinct animals vividly brought back to life, sculpted from compost, grass, feathers and grasses found in the areas where these beasts once roamed. Admission is free.

It's The Wright Year...at the Wright time. And in the Wright place.

Joseph Wright is widely regarded as an artist who was completely in tune with his age: capable of illustrating the dramatic advances which were being made in the arts, science, philosophy, and religion in what was a golden era for the City of Derby. Better known to the world simply as "Wright of Derby", the year ahead will not simply earn his work even greater acclaim, but will also help to carry his name - as well as that of his home city - to a much wider audience. It's "The Wright Year" for Derby to become one of the most talked about cities in Britain. The focal point will be a major exhibition, organised by The National Gallery and Derby Museums Trust, [Wright of Derby: From the Shadows](#), which will be staged in London from 7 November 2025 to 10 May 2026. But Derby Museums has already lifted the lid on an artist who enjoyed national acclaim and took the 18th century art world by storm - but who rarely left Derby, a place that deeply shaped his identity and artistic output. Their latest exhibition, running to 7 September, is [Joseph Wright of Derby: Life on Paper](#).

Join The Spirit Run at Derby Market Hall

[The Spirit Run Distillery](#) and Bar has been launched at Derby Market Hall. The venue is the latest venture from Darley Abbey Wines and will occupy the newly-renovated former Poultry Market. At the heart of it all will be the distillery, creating high-quality spirits inside bespoke, British-made copper stills. The Spirit Run Bar allows customers the chance to admire the iconic stills while enjoying a cocktail, a refreshing gin, or a glass of wine. Innovative gin and cocktail experiences will be available, and can be booked for mixed groups or private parties. Customers can also choose from eight draft beers, including selections from Derbyshire's Thornbridge brewery, and enjoy a rotating list of 'discovery wines'.

New skatepark and padel courts set to bring world class facilities to Derby

Founded in London to unite communities through sport, Social Sports Society will open one of the UK's largest indoor padel centres in Derby this autumn, marking its third location outside London following the launch of successful venues in Birmingham and Manchester. Padel is now one of the UK's most rapidly expanding sports, known for its simple rules, fast-paced play and inclusive appeal. Flo Skatepark, meanwhile, will join Social Sports Society in the former Eagle Market space in the city centre shopping mall, Derbion. This will result in a world-class skateboarding hub for the East Midlands. Supported by Sport England and accredited by Skateboard GB, Flo Skatepark will offer lessons for all ages and abilities, host regular events and lead creative programmes designed to get people active and involved. <https://shorturl.at/r7iDs>

The "full-on pop-party experience" will feature tribute acts to pop stars including Ariana Grande, Taylor Swift, Sabrina Carpenter, Beyonce and Dua Lipa. Designed as a perfect day out for mums and daughters to enjoy, the event is for ages 5+.

29 August, 2025

Derby's urban garden and events space, Electric Daisy, is set to present a culinary experience called [FEED](#), where food, community and sustainability will converge on one unforgettable evening. With a menu by menu by Cherrypickle Catering, diners will be welcomed with a drink on arrival, followed by canapes in the garden and two further courses to be served seated under the pergola, in a communal dining setup. Tickets cost from £55.25 a head.

Look what's brewing at the Museum of Making in September

3 to 7 September, 2025

[Derby Beer Festival](#) returns to the historic surroundings of the Museum of Making, bringing together over 130 real ales from the best of Britain's breweries, alongside a selection of ciders, world beers and craft keg. A range of food will be provided by the Museum's River Kitchen.

Be DEKA FIT in Derby

6 to 7 September, 2025

For the first time ever, the full [DEKA FIT](#) experience is coming to the UK - and Derby has been selected as its host. Dubbed "the ultimate fitness test", it's a functional fitness challenge featuring 10 workout zones, each separated by 500 metres of running. Each event challenges endurance, strength, and conditioning in a different way.

Let the countdown to Lara Croft's 30th birthday begin

11 October, 2025

Next year marks the Lara Croft's 30th birthday, and a full series of events is being planned to mark the occasion. In the meantime, the unofficial, one-day fan event [#TR29](#) is back for its 5th consecutive year in October, and it promises to be a big year for fans with panels, autograph sessions, photo opportunities and a line-up of event guests.
