Supertram Man finds a new home at The National Tramway Museum

Supertram Man and other items relating to the Sheffield Supertram system have recently been donated to The National Tramway Museum at Crich.

On 21st March this year, the 27-year partnership between Stagecoach and Supertram ended when ownership transferred to South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA). It will now be operated through a subsidiary, South Yorkshire Future Trams Limited (SYFTL).

To represent the end of this era, memorabilia, uniform, ticket machines, and the colourful 'Supertram Man' costume will now become part of the Museum's collection.

Curator Kate Watts said:

"We're delighted to welcome Supertram Man to our collection! We're keen to preserve material relating to our current tramway systems, as they're an important part of the story of British tramways and will become historic items for future generations".

When active, Supertram Man encouraged safety around trams and helped with local charity collections. He'll now become part of the National Tramway Museum collection as part of the Sheffield Supertram story.
