Derby, the city where modern art began

This is quite a claim. For *any* city in the world. But for Derby to even be a part of the conversation, when such grand matters of art are discussed in the finest museums and galleries around the globe, speaks volumes for the fact that the city is being talked of as the place where one of the biggest tipping points in art history took place - from “traditional”, to “modern”. And it’s writer and art historian Matthew Wilson, who has opened the debate through BBC Culture Online, by claiming, [Why this 1768 painting could be the real birth of modern art](#). The painting he is referring to is Joseph Wright of Derby’s *An Experiment on a Bird in the Air Pump* (1768) - one of The National Gallery’s Top 10 most requested paintings; and presently one of the many stars of the show at The National’s exhibition which runs to 10 May, *Wright of Derby: From the Shadows*. “While many argue that ‘modern art’ began in the 1800s,” writes Wilson. “Could it actually have started with Joseph Wright of Derby’s *An Experiment on a Bird in the Air Pump*, nearly a century before?”

Going loco down at The Engine Room

A new dining area in Derby, located on Riverlights Boulevard in Derby, just metres from the River Derwent, has brought more “upscale-casual dining” to the heart of the city centre. 10 January 2026

Make Derby your base to see the Ashbourne Royal Shrovetide Football match

17-18 February 2026

Unlike a conventional football match, [Shrovetide Football](#) is much longer than a regular football match and is played over two eight-hour periods. The goals are three miles apart and there are very few rules. The ball is rarely kicked but instead moves through a giant 'hug'. There is no set pitch: the game is played throughout the entire town, so shops and businesses board up their windows in preparation!

Mythic Echoes present [Vampire Games Day II](#) - a celebration of vampire-themed roleplaying games in The Museum on The Wardwick.
