

The Heights of Abraham reopens this weekend

The Heights of Abraham cable cars and 60 acre country park will be reopening this weekend for the first time since the Covid-19 lockdown which forced the award winning visitor attraction to close back in March.

Under the new Covid-19 safety arrangements the popular family destination will limit the number of guests per day, and all cable car tickets must be booked online in advance via the company's website.

Rupert Pugh, (Development Director), said today: "Our team have been working hard to ensure that the cable cars, cavern tours, exhibitions and playgrounds are ready for visitors to enjoy this summer. We've been amazed at the level of support and encouragement from the public during the last few months, and tickets have been selling fast since we went back online earlier this week".

The 60 acre country park has had to introduce new safety features and social distancing protocols on the cable cars, in cavern tours and throughout the visitor complex. Rupert explains: We have installed over 20 hand sanitiser points and 18 brand new hand washing stations at key locations, introduced one way routes to help with social distancing, and rearranged our catering spaces to allow for plenty of space both inside and out. We have also increased the fresh air flow through our cable cars, giving you a real oxygen boost as you glide over the Derwent Valley".
